We are pleased to announce that ConvaTec has awarded a contribution of \$5,000 for operational support to FOW-USA for 2014. These funds will help us fulfill the requests we receive for supplies from ostomy support groups and health centers in developing countries. We greatly appreciate ConvaTec's commitment to helping ostomates throughout the world.

Dear Friends.

In this president's report I will share with you a section from our 2013-2014 annual report. One of our Directors who is also the chair of our fundraising committee, Marilyn Zuckerman, has yearly compiled Friends of Ostomates Worldwide—USA's data and written a report. The report is several pages long but I thought you might like to hear what we are doing to get the word out about our mission. The following is taken directly from that report:

Public Outreach

FOW-USA has expanded its outreach through social media in FY2014. With a Facebook page, a Twitter account and a revised website (www.fowusa.org), FOW-USA communicates its mission and message to the general public, to ostomates in the U.S. and overseas, and to hospitals, ostomy support groups, and health professionals in the developing world. In addition, FOW-USA continues to produce two newsletters per year, sending over 2,500 by regular mail and 1,200 by e-mail. The newsletters are also posted on the organization's website and can be downloaded, viewed and printed by visitors to the site. The website attracts an average of 660 visitors per month, about 80% new visitors.

FOW-USA Board members are actively involved in spreading the FOW-USA message to ostomy-related groups such as the Wound, Ostomy, and Continence Nurses Society (WOCN) and the United Ostomy Associations of America (UOAA). They staffed exhibit booths at national and regional conferences of these organizations and distributed information about FOW-USA. Many visitors to the exhibit booths signed up to receive copies of the FOW-USA Newsletter by e-mail. The newsletters and other messages from FOW-USA are sent to the UOAA for distribution to their support groups on a regular basis.

Going farther afield, two Board members, Ival Secrest, Past President, and Ruth Salinger, Shipping Coordinator, traveled to Cordoba, Argentina in October, 2013 to attend a meeting of the Western Hemisphere countries of the International Ostomy Association. Representatives of ostomy groups from North, Central, and South America and the Caribbean were in attendance. Ival and Ruth spoke with individuals from groups that receive supplies from FOW-USA and showed a Power-Point in Spanish about the organization. Appreciation for the supplies received was expressed by many in attendance.

An article entitled, "Friends of Ostomates Worldwide-USA: Contributing to Success in Living with a Stoma", by Jan Colwell, President, was published in the Fall 2013 issue of "Ostomy and Wound Management Nursing" a professional nursing journal.

We feel that it is very important to get the word out about activities in which FOW-USA is involved so that we can let people know of our mission. Professional groups can help us by spreading the word to their membership about the need for products and monetary donations. Getting the word out also helps those who know of people in need contact us for the needed supplies. I would ask that if you are reading our newsletter in a hard copy that you share that hard copy with your local ostomy group, your health care team or others who would benefit from this information. Additionally, if you are reading this message via a computer, that you forward the newsletter to people who need to know more about FOW-USA. Help us spread the word.

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### **Ostomy Pearls**

New in Ostomy Skin Barriers

The opening in the skin barrier (the beige portion of most pouching systems, the part that provides a seal of the pouch to the skin and protects the skin), is one of the most important parts of the pouching system. The opening should be approximately the same size as the stoma so that no skin is showing between the skin and the stoma. There are precut skin barriers in a round shape and cut-to-fit skin barriers that can be custom cut to fit the skin barrier. A newer option in skin barriers are moldable, shapeable or stretch to fit skin barriers. This type of skin barrier allows the stoma opening to be shaped with fingers rather than using scissors. 1 Several manufacturers have this type of product and to understand the correct way to use the products, it is advisable to consult the manufacturer. via their website or at meeting such as the United Ostomy Associations of America meetings when the vendors are invited. The moldable, shapeable or stretchable skin barriers are available flat or convex, and no scissors are needed. They may be useful for those with poor hand dexterity or poor eyesight which may make cutting the barrier to size difficult. This type of barrier is available in both one and two piece products. This may be a consideration in the stoma management and is one of the newer innovations in stoma care. An example of the product is shown below:
